Middlebury July 2 1813

my Dear Husband

we arrived at Burlington

last night at ten sent up to the ~~post~~ stage house engaged our ~~passage~~ seats in the stage we then went to bed was waked in <sup>ing</sup> morn- at half after two with the morning gun I got up and dress'd myself, in a short time the stage horn was blowed for us I waked Charles & the men we went on shore the stage was full of men I had to set between two limbs of the law & came ~~of~~ so all the way they was polite to me we arrived here a little after twelve with <sup>we</sup> twelve in the stage found our friends all well & very happy to se us I have had out 7 dol, & a quart & feel as well as can be expected for ~~the~~ ~~parture~~

I have had, I beg that you will write me ~~on the~~ ~~immediately~~ & let me know the <sup>particulars</sup> ~~do~~ <sup>- how you</sup> & the family the Cap<sup>t</sup> of the steer boat, <sup>told me</sup> that he intends leave <sup>ing</sup> Burlington <sup>for</sup> ~~every~~ <sup>Plattsburgh</sup> ~~Wednesday~~ <sup>Thursday</sup> early & return the same day, the family joins me in love to you our family and friends kiss my Dear little girls for me and tell them to be good girls — that we may enjoy much of the presence of God when ~~separated~~ <sup>again</sup> & when we meet is my sincere
